

FAQ's :Fort Bend County and Houston Housing Authority (HHA) Vouchers

1. Does the letter apply to me?	This letter was for your information and only applies if you are residing in Fort Bend County with a Houston Housing Authority (HHA) voucher
2. Do I need to move now?	This was for your information only . You were presented with your options to be made by <u>your next Recertification</u> and only if you live in Fort Bend Co.
3. I live in a zip code that is in both Fort Bend and Harris County	The letter only applies if you are in the part of the zip code that is within Fort Bend Co. The RHA will not assist you if you live outside of Fort Bend Co in your zip code.
4. How do I know if I'm in Fort Bend Co or Harris Co?	You may go to Fort Bend Co. Appraisal District's website (Click Here) and do a property search. If your address is found, you are in fort bend co. If not, the letter does not apply to you.
5. I have questions about what I should do.	Stay Put. You don't need to do a thing . This letter was for your information only . Any decision to move or port must start with HHA. Your voucher still belongs to them. The RHA cannot help you unless you port to the RHA . Any questions about your voucher must answered by your HHA Housing Counselor.
6. Why am I receiving this letter now? I've lived here for years.	The Rosenberg Housing Authority received authorization to operate in Fort Bend Co late last year.
7. How do I port to your agency?	In most cases, you must finish out your current lease before porting. You must inform your HHA Housing Counselor at your recertification interview and request to port. You may also refer to the RHA's website at https://www.rosenbergha.org/portability/ to find information specific to the RHA.
8. I would like to stay with HHA	You may stay with HHA, but if you reside in Fort Bend Co., you must move from your current unit and into HHA's jurisdiction at your next recertification
9. Do I need to move into Rosenberg, TX?	No, even though we are the Rosenberg Housing Authority, you may reside in any zip code that is Fort Bend Co. that will accept your HCV voucher.
10. What is the RHA's jurisdiction?	You can find a jurisdiction map at Click Here .
11. What does partial and full mean on the jurisdiction map?	Partial means that only some of the zip code is in Fort Bend Co. Full means all of the zip code is in Fort Bend Co. The RHA may only operate in the part of the zip code residing in Fort Bend Co.
12. Do I now belong to the RHA?	No, your voucher is still with the HHA. All communication to move or port must originate with the HHA.
13. My letter has a recertification date for the current month or in the past. What do I do?	You do not need to do anything. Stay where you are until your next recertification and then

	choose one of the options that was presented in your letter, if it applies to you. If HHA requires that you port to the RHA, you must start the process with the HHA. The RHA cannot help you until we receive your portability packet.
14. I would like to port now.	You must talk to HHA and see if porting is possible or if you must stay until your next recertification.
15. If I port to RHA will my voucher size remain the same?	Your voucher size may change. The RHA's subsidy standard is one bedroom for every 2 persons except for persons of the opposite sex will be allocated separate bedrooms (other than spouses, and children under age 5)
16. Will my portion of the rent remain the same?	Each housing authority has their own utility allowances and payment standards. So your portion of rent will likely change.
